Self-Reflection Before Feedback

After every lesson, take a few minutes to reflect with honesty and grace. Self-reflection isn't self-criticism—it's awareness guided by the Spirit. Answer these 3 evaluative questions:

- Did I stay faithful to the text? (Did I say what God said, or what I wanted to say?)
- Did my teaching lead to transformation? (Did I challenge people to learn & live the Word?)
- Did I communicate clearly? (Was my message simple, structured, and engaging?)

Inviting Helpful Feedback

Ask two or three people trusted enough to give honest feedback. Listen with humility and gratitude and record their responses. Feedback is a gift that strengthens your teaching.

Ask questions like:

- Was my message clear?
- Did I connect the text to life effectively?
- Where did you feel the group engage most?

Pray over what's shared and decide what to improve next time.
